ELECTRONIC PARKING BRAKE

INFORMATION

Where fitted, the electronic parking brake (EPB) replaces the mechanical handbrake and is designed to prevent the vehicle from accidently rolling away. This syetem offers convenience and safety features in addition to those normally associated with a mechanical handbrake. Please refer to the primary Vehicle Instruction Guide for information about other operational instructions.







LOCATION

The diagrams above indicate example locations of the electronic parking brake (A) which is labelled with the universal icon symbol: (P)



The EPB will normally auto activate. If will also activate if seat belts are not being worn, or when luggage placed on top of seats activates the system. To enable the system to function correctly, fasten seatbelts, and remove luggage from the seats and store it securely in the boot. Pull the switch labelled A to manually apply the parking brake. The warning lamps on both the switch and instrument panel will light up to confirm its activation.

DEACTIVATION

The EPB will normally auto release. Depress the brake or accelerator pedal to auto release it, or press the switch (A) to manually release it. The associated warning lamps on both the switch and dashboard instrument panel will go out to confirm its deactivation. Note: seatbelts should be fastened, and luggage should not be placed on seats.

WHEN DRIVING AWAY

The parking brake will deactivate automatically when driving away, and it also prevents the vehicle from rolling back unintentionally for a few seconds when starting on a gradient. This works by driving off in a normal way, the parking brake will automatically release and the vehicle will start moving in the desired direction.

On vehicles fitted with an automatic gear box, you can apply the parking brake when stopping briefly at traffic lights etc., to avoid the vehicle creeping forward. When you drive off the parking brake will be automatically released.

DEADLOCKS

Deadlock / safelock messages shown on the instrument display when the engine is turned off simply indicate that once you exit the vehicle and lock the doors, they're effectively deadlocked and anyone left in the car wouldn't be able to get out in the event of an emergency. The warning is nothing to worry about and is just a standard advisory message.

SEATBELT WARNING LIGHTS

A seatbelt warning light may illuminate when the engine is turned on. This may mean that the electronic parking brake (EPB) becomes auto activated to prevent vehicle movement. To deactivate these warning lights, and turn off the auto activation of the EPB in this instance, ensure all passengers fasten their seatbelts, and remove any luggage from on top of the seats. For safety secure all luggage inside the boot.

WARNING LIGHTS AND WHAT THEY MEAN

Don't panic! Despite seeing a new light pop-up on your instrument panel, unless it is red it is likely the car is still running fine, and while there may be a problem to attend to, proceed with confidence and patience.

RED indicates a potentially serious problem or safety issue. Attend to it! Red may also indicate an important reminder.

TYRE PRESSURES (COLD)

Check tyre pressure regularly Legal minimum tread depth is 1.6 mm

Confirm tyre inflation pressures by consulting the tyre pressure table found on the driver's door B-pillar.

Some vehicles are fitted with an electronic tyre pressure monitoring system. Spacesaver spare wheels have limited distance and speed ratings.

IN CASE OF BREAKDOWN

Use hazard lights. Attempt to park in a safe position.

Use an emergency phone rather than a mobile as emergency services will then know the location of the vehicle.

CHILD SEATS

Never use a child seat in a front passenger seat which is fitted with an active airbag (SRS). Follow all fitting instructions carefully.

Check seat positioning and security before use.



Vehicle specifications are subject to change. When the engine is turned off, ensure that the starter switch is in position II when operating electrical items such as door mirrors and windows, etc. This vehicle does not include any manufacturer handbooks or manuals.

USEFUL INFORMATION ABOUT YOUR VEHICLE

Locking the doors?

— Use the smart key. Centrally locked. Deadlocked. Press to lock or unlock and disable the alarm. For 2 stage unlocking: Single press unlocks driver's door. Double press unlocks all doors and tailgate. Press and hold the hazard triangle button to activate the panic alarm. For keyless entry - retain the key in your pocket or bag and press the button on the door handle to unlock and disarm the alarm. Doors auto lock on driving away. When leaving the vehicle, switch off, select Park (P), apply parking brake, press the lock button on smart key to lock and arm alarm. To double lock, press the button twice within 3 seconds, an audible beep confirms double locking.

Anti-theft system? Opening the tailgate?

- Vehicles are fitted with an alarm system. Passive arming of electronic engine immobiliser. Visible VIN.
 Centrally locked. To release tailgate press the smart key button to unlock and open, or close. All other doors and alarm remain locked and active. For hands-free opening sensors under the rear bumper are activated by foot gesture movement which is used to auto open or close the powered tailgate (if fitted).
- Electric internal adjustment operated via a control pad on the driver's door.

- Electric front and rear operated via control switches on the driver's door.

 If fitted: electric sliding panoramic glass sunroof, operated by roof mounted switchgear.

 Power operated child locks on rear doors. Press the button on the driver's door to activate. Or lock all doors and tailgate with the central locking button. Ensure the doors are securely closed and locked for safety.

Ensure that the smart key is carried in your pocket or bag. Ensure Park (P) is selected and parking brake is on. Press the brake pedal. Press the motor start/stop button to start or stop the engine. Move the gear selector to select N for neutral, R for reverse or D for drive. To select R, N or D, wear the seatbelt and depress the brake pedal, then move gear selector. Auto deactivate parking brake by selecting D or R on gear selector. Select gear. Release brake pedal and gently press the accelerator. When switching off, select Park (P) and apply the parking brake. Models feature automatic engine start/stop whereby the engine automatically shuts off when stationary, foot pedals are not depressed and gears are in neutral - engine instantly restarts when the foot pedals are depressed.

Battery charging?

— Charging port located under flap on front nearside wing. With vehicle unlocked, lightly press the mid rear flap edge to open to reveal charge port and cable unlock button. **UNLOCKING CHARGE PORT:** To unlock the port, press the smart key button OR driver's door button. Ensure the key is carried with you when pressing the cable unlock button to ensure it will release. To connect the cable, unlock the vehicle, ensure Park (P) is selected, turn off the vehicle and open the charge port. **CABLE CONNECTION:** First connect the cable to the power source, then connect the cable to the vehicle input charge port. Follow any instructions on charging stations. The cable is locked in position once connected. Charging will commence once cable is connected and charging status is displayed on the drivers touchscreen. CHARGING STATUS LEDs: White - normal; White flashing - initialisation; Blue flashing - charging is paused; Green flashing - charging in progress; Green solid - charging is complete; Red flashes - charging fault. CABLE DISCONNECTION: Unlock the cable from the vehicle charge port by pressing the button next to the plug. Press the cable release button as necessary. Replace the protective cap as necessary. Close the charge port. Remove the connector from the charge station as required. **RECHARGE TIME**: 0-80% recharge with 11kW wall box takes 9 hours or 7 hours for a 7kW wall box; 50kW public charging 0-80% in 85 minutes; 100kW rapd DC chargers take 40 minutes. **BATTERY CONDITION**: Avoid repetitive charging to 100%. To maintain battery condition recharge to 80% (this level can be set on the touchscreen in the *vehicle* preconditioning menu). The touchscreen indicates current battery status and estimated range. REGENERATIVE BRAKING: whenever the accelerator is not depressed whilst driving surplus energy may be fed back to the battery. VEHICLE RANGE: driving range displayed is only an estimation and is indicative only. Always ensure that charging is stopped and the charge cable is unlocked before disconnection. To release - press the smart key button to unlock or press the button on the lower right of dashboard, pull the safety catch under the

- bonnet lid. All other doors and alarm remain locked and active if these have been secured. The rear seats are divided into sections (60:40 or 40:20:40) which can be separately folded. Unlock the seat catch before folding. When returning the seat to normal use ensure seat is firmly locked into position.
- Vehicles are not normally supplied with a spare wheel or tyre repair kit. For any assistance in the event of having a punctured tyre, or should the vehicle not be supplied with a spare wheel and tyre or a tyre repair kit, please call the Europcar Tyre Helpline 0800 0280 999.
- To scroll between various driving modes for various road and environmental conditions, use the buttons on right of centre console to choose and select a relevant driving mode option (rain ice snow; dynamic; comfort; or eco).
